Application Process	 Once nominated by your home institution, students must apply in the SBUAbroad Portal by clicking here. Students will need to provide the following documentation: Study Statement: A one page, typed Study Statement uploaded to your application. Passport: Upload a clear copy of the information page of your passport. TOEFL (if applicable): Exchange/Visiting students must have a minimum of 80 IBT, 9 Essential or 6.5 IELTS. Upload a clear image of the unexpired proficiency score. Stony Brook University does not accept MyBest scores. Home University Transcripts: Upload a clear image of your home university transcripts.
Housing Accommodations	On campus housing is guaranteed and arranged for all exchange and visiting students. No application or deposit is required. Students will stay in one of six resident facilities, each with computing and fitness centers and within walking distance of their classes.
Visa and Immigration Policies	 Students are required to obtain a J-1 visa. Stony Brook University's Visa and Immigration Services Office will contact J-1 students to apply for the DS-2019 form. In order to maintain their J-1 status, students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 U.S. credits per semester. A minimum of 9 credits must be in-person and a maximum of 3 credits can be taken online. Health Insurance	Students are required to have SBU's health insurance. Students will automatically be enrolled and will be charged in their SBU SOLAR account accordingly



Courses	 Our student bulletin contains all undergraduate courses offered at Stony Brook University. Please note, course offerings are subject to change and offerings may vary by semester. Restricted courses: Health-sciences, School of Medicine, School of Nursing, School of Dental Medicine, and Pharmacology subjects and Writing 101 & 102, BUS 301, CSE 316, CSE 320, CSE 416, CSE Graduate Courses, EEO (Electrical Engineering Online), EGL 360. Limited courses: Theater Arts, Dance, some language courses, and Computer Science. CSE/ISE - Limit 2 courses per semester ACC/BUS - Limit 2 courses per semester Students must be registered in a minimum of 12 U.S. credits and a maximum of 17 U.S. credits during their first semester at Stony Brook. Academic year students may register for a maximum of 19 credits during their second semester if they have at least a 3.0 GPA.
Course Registration Process	 In mid-May for the fall semester and December for the spring semester, students will receive course enrollment instructions. Please note: It is up to the Academic Department to determine whether or not you have met the prerequisites to enroll in a specific course. Course registration is based upon seat availability at the time of registration. We cannot guarantee enrollment into any course.

Co-Curricular Activities	Exchange students are encouraged to participate in the 350+ <u>clubs and organizations</u> on-campus!
Tuition and Fees	Exchange students will receive a tuition waiver. However they are responsible for <u>university fees</u> , <u>meal plan</u> (if warranted), health insurance and <u>on-campus housing fees</u> .



Estimated Costs

To be eligible for a Form DS-2019, exchange visitors must provide adequate proof of liquid funds that meet or exceed the estimated educational and living expenses for the first academic year. Exchange visitors will be given a letter from their SBU Coordinator indicating their tuition waiver. This letter can be used during the Form DS-2019 request process. Fee-paying students will be subject to pay out-of-state tuition
