The required English language level is B2/IELTS score 6 (or equivalent). Please note that some courses may have higher entry requirements and can seek guidance from our mobility team.

Be advised certain courses at Camberwell, Chelsea and Wimbledon only accept incoming students during a particular period (either Block 1 or Block 2). The student's home university should check which semester Camberwell, Chelsea and Wimbledon's chosen programme accepts exchange students.

CREDIT TRANSFER

Upon successful completion of the exchange programme, students will be awarded a Transcript (a document that details the units you have passed/failed) from UAL.

- 1 UAL credit = 0,5 ECTS - most exchange students will take 60 UAL credits to attain 30 ECTS.

- In exceptional circumstances, students may be able to take 40 UAL credits to attain 20 ECTS. However, this should be checked with UAL's college mobility team for approval. Students should also ensure they are approved to do so with their home institution.
- Assessments are submitted at the end of each unit. Students should do the self-directed study on a weekly basis as outlined in the unit handbooks to keep on top of workload and prepare for the submission at the end of the unit.

INSURANCE

UAL has a basic insurance policy covering all students, but it is not comprehensive. Note that students are not insured for any activity that is not related to their course or the University. It is therefore recommended that students take their own insurance for the period they are abroad or check with their home university if they are adequately covered. All students must take full health coverage as they will not be covered during their stay at UAL.





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
