Student Application Process

Exchange Student

Exchange students are nominated by their home university to study at MUIC under a reciprocal exchange agreement established through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Students remain registered at their home institution, and credit transfer is subject to their home university's approval.

Visiting Student

Non-reciprocal students who apply to study at MUIC for one trimester or up to one academic year. They may come from partner or non-partner universities. Students remain registered at their home institution, and credit transfer is subject to their home university's approval.

- Visiting Students: A minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Students from Partner Universities: Must adhere to the GPA requirements of their home university

Required Documents

Exchange Students

Requirements:

- **A copy of passport** (valid for at least 6 months after study abroad completion at MUIC)
 - **An official transcript** (stamped or certified by the home university)
 - **Certificate of English Proficiency** (for students who are not native English speakers)*
 - TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 69 (Writing score 22)
- **Please note that effective January 21, 2026, the required TOEFL (iBT) Writing score must be equivalent to 4.5, in accordance with the new score comparison criteria.*
- IELTS (Academic) overall 6 (Writing 6)
 - PTE (Academic) overall 50
 - Other qualification showing equivalent English Language proficiency accepted from previous students
- **A nomination letter** from the home university
 - **Proof of international health insurance**** (in English only and must have a branch office in Thailand)
 - **Student ID photo** in JPEG format with size 1200 x 1400 pixels. ([Sample photo](#)) (The photo background must be either in plain blue or white and a shirt must be plain white with a collar and without suit, tie, blouse, etc.)

Please contact your home university to nominate you as an exchange student. Once you have been nominated, you will receive an email about "Application for Inbound Exchange Student at MUIC" sent by icia@mahidol.ac.th, regarding the next steps of instructions to complete your application.

Visiting Students

Requirements:

- **A copy of passport** (valid for at least 6 months after study abroad completion at MUIC)
 - **An official transcript** (stamped or certified by the home university)
 - **Certificate of English Proficiency** (for students who are not native English speakers)*
 - TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 69 (Writing score 22)
- **Please note that effective January 21, 2026, the required TOEFL (iBT) Writing score must be equivalent to 4.5, in accordance with the new score comparison criteria.*
- IELTS (Academic) overall 6 (Writing 6)
 - PTE (Academic) overall 50
 - Other qualifications showing equivalent English Language proficiency that have previously been accepted
- **A proof of student's enrollment** issued by the home university
 - **A reference letter** issued by the home university
 - **Proof of international health insurance**** (in English only and must have a branch office in Thailand)
 - **55 USD Visiting Application Fee** (non-refundable)
 - **Student ID photo** in JPEG format with size 1200 x 1400 pixels. ([Sample photo](#)) (The photo background must be either in plain blue or white and a shirt must be plain white with a collar and without suit, tie, blouse, etc.)

Certificate of English Proficiency

* This requirement is waived for exchange and visiting students who are from native-English-speaking countries. Exchange and visiting students from English-medium institutions may provide a certifying letter from their home university, stating that they have met the minimum requirement of an IELTS (Academic) overall score of 6.0 (with a writing score of 6.0) or an equivalent qualification, as proof of their English proficiency.

Proof of International Health Insurance Policy

Proof of international health insurance (in English) covering inpatient (IPD), outpatient (OPD), and accident treatment at private hospitals in Thailand is required.

Insurance with direct billing at hospitals is strongly recommended, as reimbursement-only plans may require upfront payment that many students find difficult to manage in emergencies.

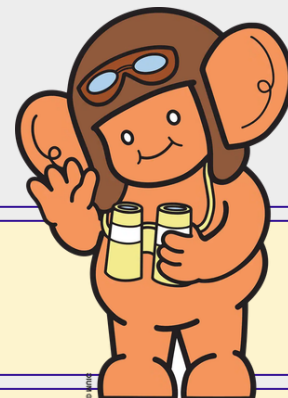


Programs Offered

Additionally, each division set specific eligibility restrictions, which will be provided during the registration process.

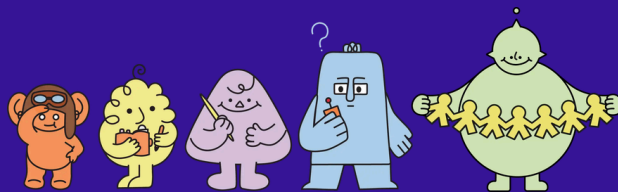

Academic overview:

MUIC academic calendar operates on a trimester system. Each trimester has 12 weeks of lecture classes and one week of final exams. Lecture classes are scheduled every day between 8:00 - 18:00 hrs. Classes usually take place for two hours/day twice per week. Each course is worth 4 MUIC credits with equaling 48 hours of lectures.

Course load:

Inbound students are required to enroll in a minimum of 12 credits, which is typically equivalent to three lecture courses. The standard course load for exchange students is 16 credit hours per trimester, while visiting students can take up to 20 credits.

Special Note:

At MUIC, exchange and visiting students cannot enroll in research project classes and internships. Additionally, not all courses listed in the course catalog are offered every term, and exchange students may need approval from program directors to register for classes that require prerequisite courses.

Examination Policy

MUIC does not offer early or alternative examinations, nor is there a policy for retaking exams.

Visa Information & Uniforms

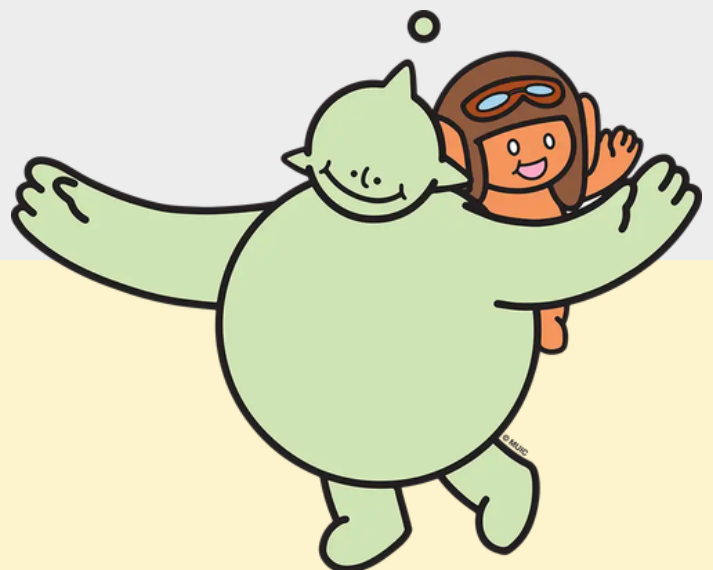
Visa Information

All students must obtain a Non-ED (student) visa before entering Thailand. MUIC will send a supporting letter directly to the student's email for use in the visa application at the Royal Thai Embassy in their home country. Working part-time or engaging in employment under a Non-ED visa is strictly prohibited by Thai immigration law.

Uniforms

- Students must wear the regular uniform while attending classes at MUIC and anywhere else on campus. Uniforms can be purchased on campus or at uniform shops around campus. Alternatively, students may bring their own: white button-front shirts with black skirts for females, or white button-front shirts with black trousers for males. Black or dark colored shoes which cover the heel, or plain sport shoes (No Flip-flops or Sandals)

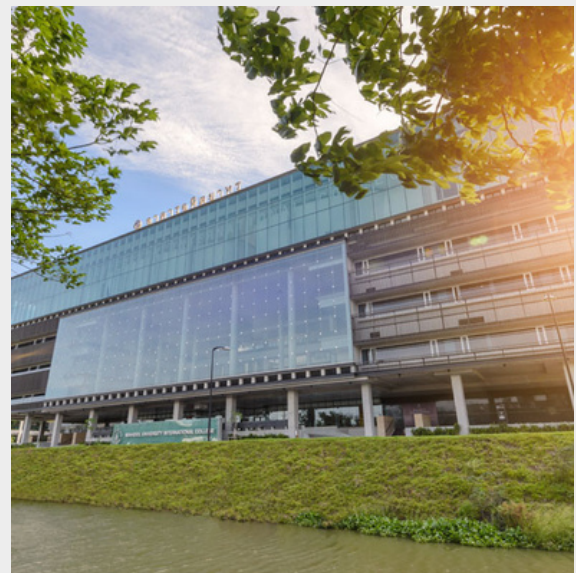

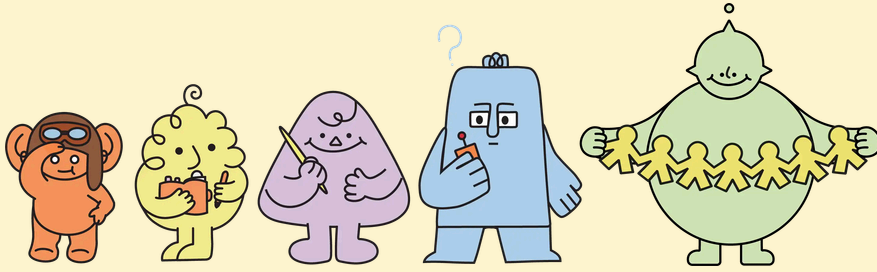

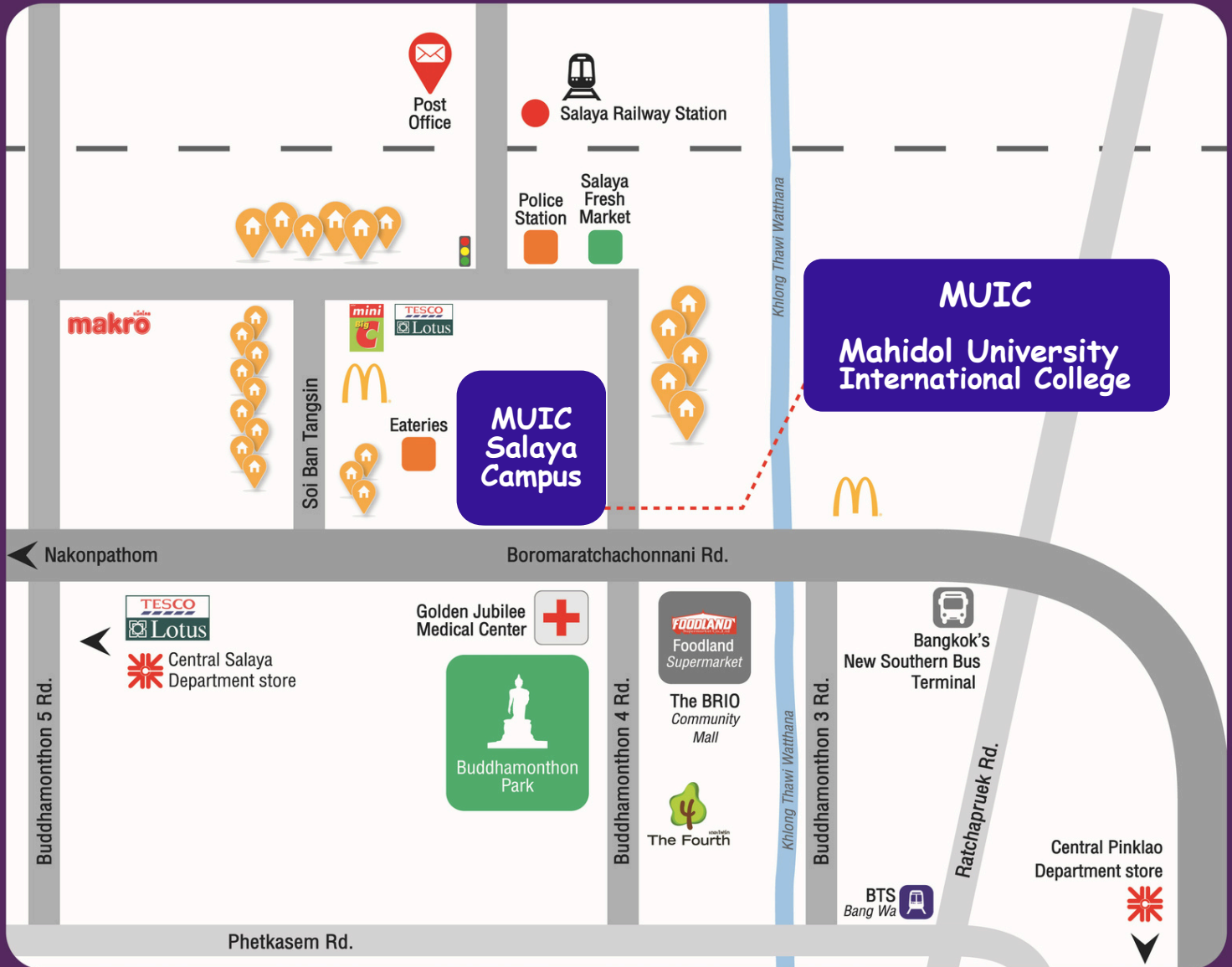
