## Nomination and Application Process

#### Nomination

- 1) Go to studyinmexico.tec.mx/nominate.
- 2) Select the right option and input the code you got via email from our Central Office. If you didn't get the code, fill out the form to get it. If you have another issue while nominating, please contact <u>studyinmexico@itesm.mx</u> for assistance.

#### After nomination

- 1) Students will receive an email with the information to start the application after they are nominated. **Please ask your students to check their junk and spam folders** if they don't get the email automatically.
- 2) As an admission requirement, students must upload a scan of their valid passport.
- 3) The admission decision will be sent via email.


#### Course Catalog

- ✤ For the Summer 2022 term, the only available campuses will be Ciudad de México, Estado de México, Guadalajara, Monterrey, Santa Fe, and Querétaro.
- ✤ For the Fall 2022 term, the only available campuses will be Ciudad de México, Guadalajara, Monterrey, Santa Fe (only for business), and Querétaro.
- ✤ Not all campuses offer the 47 disciplines. Medicine and Health Sciences is only available in Monterrey, Guadalajara, and Ciudad de México.

## **Credits and Evaluation**

The number of credits given by a course is defined by the number of class hours and self-study time a student must spend weekly in the subject.

# TEC21 Model



- Each course provides different amounts of credits.
- ► Courses can last 5, 10 or 15 weeks.
- ► A full academic workload is considered at 18 TEC credits (30 ECTS or 18 USA credits).
- ► Attendance to courses is mandatory.
- Class size averages 30 students.
- Homework is assigned regularly.
- Courses are offered in three models: remotely, hybrid, and in-person
- ▶ Minimum passing grade of 70/100.

## $| \oplus |$ Migration Process

The migration process is defined by the nationality of the student.

- ★ Non-restricted nationalities: Require an FMM (migratory form obtained upon entry to the country), but do not need a visa if the stay is for 180 days or less (semester or summer).
- ★ Restricted nationalities: Require a visa that must be issued at any Mexican consulate or embassy, regardless of the time of stay. To review the list of restricted nationalities, visit: <u>https://bit.ly/INMrequiredvisa</u>

# 🚸 Health Insurance

All students participating on our international programs are required to get the SURA health insurance recommended by Tecnológico de Monterrey. The insurance must be bought before arriving to Mexico
