## Application Procedure

1. Partner universities nominate their students for an Exchange program at Macquarie university within the corresponding time frame. Nominations are submitted through our [Nomination Form](#).





The following documents must be attached to each nomination:


- Academic transcripts: If your student is applying to a postgraduate program, postgraduate transcripts and undergraduate transcripts and degree award are required.
- Proof of English language proficiency (if applicable):
  - Such as IELTS (Academic) - Minimum requirement: 6.5 overall with 6.0 in each section. For a detailed list of other acceptable levels of English proficiency and English language package providers as approved by Macquarie University, please refer to our [English Language Requirements page](#) OR
  - Other supporting documentation as per application requirements previously agreed upon by Macquarie University.

- Once the student's nomination has been approved by Macquarie University, the home university will share the [application link](#) with the student for them to submit an application to the Exchange program.

 <h3>English Requirements</h3>	<p>The minimum English entry requirement that applies to most undergraduate or postgraduate courses is IELTS (Academic) – 6.5 overall with 6.0 in each section, or equivalent.
