<p><b>Language requirements</b></p>	<p>An adequate level of (spoken and written) German is recommended, as most of our courses are held in German. We do not require a language certificate however – neither in German nor in English.</p>
<p><b>Course catalogue</b></p>	<p><b>All courses:</b> <a href="https://lfuonline.uibk.ac.at/public/lfuonline_lv.home">https://lfuonline.uibk.ac.at/public/lfuonline_lv.home</a> By clicking ‘advanced search’ students can also choose the option ‘Language of instruction’ and change it to ‘English’, ‘French’, ‘Spanish’ etc. → A list with courses taught in English will be available after clicking ‘Search’.</p> <p>Exchange students should ideally take between 16 and 30 ECTS credits per semester but they do not have to be from their major. They can also take interdisciplinary courses that are open for students from all fields or even courses from other faculties to a certain extent.</p>
<p><b>Housing (VERY IMPORTANT)</b></p>	<p><b>Student Dorms:</b> Finding accommodation is a very difficult issue here in Innsbruck.
