Application Procedure

Eligibility	Students who wish to study at AIU for one or two semesters must meet all of the requirements (Enrollment Status, GPA, English Proficiency) listed on the following webpage. https://web.aiu.ac.jp/en/short-term/semester-year-programs/eligibility/ Note of Caution about Enrollment Status: Students must have completed at least two semesters at their home university (with two semesters of grades shown on the submitted official academic transcript) by the application deadline.
How to Apply	Our application procedure consists of three steps: Step 1: Online Nomination Form *submitted by students' home institutions. Step 2: Online Application Form *submitted by nominated students. Step 3: Application Documents Submission by Email. [Step 1] Online Nomination Form	Home institutions submit the Online Nomination Form to AIU during the nomination period. AIU will then send students and their home institution a username and password for each student to access our Online Application Portal. Send all files in a single email. All documents must be in English. Academic Information

Courses Offered to International Students	All subject matter courses are taught in English and are available to international students. *International students may NOT enroll in preparatory English language courses or certain courses that are required for and restricted to degree-seeking students only. Be sure to check the restrictions indicated in the Course Offerings available at the following link. https://web.aiu.ac.jp/en/short-term/course/	
Course Registration	All new students register for courses <u>after arrival at AIU</u> . Please note that the course list students submit in their application forms is for our screening committee's reference, NOT for official course registration.	
Tips on Course Selection	 We strongly recommend students to obtain approval for as many alternatives as possible prior to arriving at AIU, in case they cannot get into their first-choice approved courses. Our class sizes are small in order to ensure maximum interaction, so the capacity of each course is limited. Please understand there is a chance students will not be able to get into their first-choice courses. Seats for courses that exceed capacity are determined by lottery and a waiting list system. Students are NOT able to register for courses which overlap in the timetable. Course Offerings, Class Schedules, and Syllabi are updated in early June (for Fall semester) and in mid October (for Spring semester). If any further slight changes occur, these will be updated again in late August (for Fall semester) and in late March (for Spring semester). Please be sure to check the latest information on Class Schedules before course registration. 	
Attendance Policy	AIU's education model emphasizes student interaction in the classroom including group and pair work activities, so attendance is mandatory . Each instructor sets their own attendance policy and in some classes, a certain number of absences can result in an automatic failing grade.	
Academic Transcript	An official academic transcript will be sent to the international office of the student's home institution by the Division of Student Records within 2-3 weeks after the end of final exams.

Money Matters	Cash Bring enough cash to cover your first 5 - 6 weeks in Japan and be sure to exchange currency to Japanese Yen before arriving in Akita. There is NO currency exchange place at Akita Airport, JR Akita Station, on campus or nearby the campus. • It will take a few weeks to open a bank account to become able to receive international wire transfers. Credit Cards • Students are strongly recommended to bring a valid credit card to Japan (Visa, MasterCard, Diner's Club, American Express). • Many major banks, hotels, restaurants, etc. accept credit cards, but the majority of local retailers, restaurants, etc. do not accept credit cards. • Students should verify that their credit card contracts allow them to use their cards in Japan before arrival.		

Arrival Information

Access to the University	The AIU campus is approximately a 10-minute drive from <u>Akita Airport</u> and a 30-minute drive from the <u>JR Akita Train station</u> . https://web.aiu.ac.jp/en/about/access/	
Arrival Date and Time	All students must arrive on campus during the designated date and times (no exceptions) in order to complete necessary paperwork related to residence registration, mandatory insurances, etc. that will need to be done on the date of arrival. If students cannot find a flight that arrives in Akita during that time, they must arrive the night before and come to campus during the designated date and time. Accepted students will be informed of the designated date and times of arrival at the time of the application results announcement.	
Pick-up Service	As public transportation is very limited in Akita, we ask that students use AIU's free pick-up bus service from Akita Airport or JR Akita Train Station at the designated times on the arrival date. Medical Preparation

Medical Information Form	All admitted students are required to submit a completed Medical Information Form, which is available in their Online Application Portal after acceptance. The Medical Information Form consists of three parts. Part I is to be completed online by students. After completing the online part (Part I), they must bring Part I and Part II to their physician who understands their mental and physical condition for completion, have their parent, guardian, or next-of-kin complete Part III, then submit ALL THREE PARTS TOGETHER by email. Students and their home university coordinator are asked to go over the Medical Information Form together before submission. Home universities should also know about any conditions students have so that we can work together to provide support in case of an emergency.
Support on AIU Campus	"Health and Medical Care Room", "Counseling Room" There is a "Health and Medical Care Room" and a "Counseling Room" on campus. Please note that there is no medical doctor stationed on campus. Bringing Medications	Students who intend to bring medications or continue using medications in Japan should prepare to bring all required medicines with them, as it may be difficult or impossible to acquire the same medicines in Japan. However, it is illegal to bring some prescription and over-the-counter medicines commonly used in the United States or other countries to Japan, including certain inhalers and certain allergy and sinus medications.
