- Must request an original copy of transcript (in English) to be sent directly to Education Abroad from your home university's registrar. An emailed version from a home institution staff member is acceptable. Emory <u>cannot</u> accept transcripts directly from students.
- Evidence of financial support (minimum \$12,000 USD/semester needed; \$24,000 for full 2024-2025 academic year). Not needed for your initial application but will be needed to issue or DS-2019 once accepted.
- Passport valid for at least 6 months after the expected return from the U.S. to home country
- Statement of Purpose: An essay, 1-2 pages double-spaced, explaining academic and personal goals for studying at Emory University
- A list of 8-10 courses of interest in the <u>Emory College of Arts and Sciences (ECAS)</u>. <u>Specific course requests cannot be guaranteed</u>. Education Abroad will accommodate requests as best as possible and enroll students in 4-5 courses. Students should be flexible with their course needs. Course Restrictions:
  - Students may <u>not</u> enroll in Freshman Seminars (190) or courses that end in a "W."
  - Students are <u>not</u> permitted to enroll in Goizueta Business School courses or other courses outside of ECAS.
  - o Students must meet any pre-requisite requirements for their proposed courses.
  - Subject areas with limited availability (popular at Emory): Psychology, Sociology, Film and Media Studies
- <u>Must</u> show proficiency in the English language by providing one of the below forms of evidence:
  - English language proficiency confirmation letter from the home university international office (only applicable if the student is enrolled in an English-taught academic program)
  - TOEFL IBT Score: 100 minimum
  - IELTS Score: 6.5 minimum
  - Cambridge English: CAE C or CPE C minimum
  - International Baccalaureate: English A2 Higher Level of Standard Level (tot 2013),
     Language and Literature Higher Level of Standard Level (vanaf 2013)

## Accommodations

**On-Campus:** Education Abroad will coordinate with Emory's Housing Office to arrange housing for all Undergraduate Exchange Students: <a href="https://housing.emory.edu/">https://housing.emory.edu/</a>.
