	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must request an original copy of transcript (in English) to be sent directly to Education Abroad from your home university's registrar. An emailed version from a home institution staff member is acceptable. Emory <u>cannot</u> accept transcripts directly from students.</li> <li>• Evidence of financial support (minimum \$12,000 USD/semester needed; \$24,000 for full 2024-2025 academic year). Not needed for your initial application but will be needed to issue or DS-2019 once accepted.</li> <li>• Passport valid for at least 6 months after the expected return from the U.S. to home country</li> <li>• Statement of Purpose: An essay, 1-2 pages double-spaced, explaining academic and personal goals for studying at Emory University</li> <li>• A list of 8-10 courses of interest in the <a href="#">Emory College of Arts and Sciences (ECAS)</a>. <u>Specific course requests cannot be guaranteed</u>. Education Abroad will accommodate requests as best as possible and enroll students in 4-5 courses. Students should be flexible with their course needs. Course Restrictions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Students may <u>not</u> enroll in Freshman Seminars (190) or courses that end in a "W."</li> <li>○ Students are <u>not</u> permitted to enroll in Goizueta Business School courses or other courses outside of ECAS.</li> <li>○ Students must meet any pre-requisite requirements for their proposed courses.</li> <li>○ Subject areas with limited availability (popular at Emory): Psychology, Sociology, Film and Media Studies</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <u>Must</u> show proficiency in the English language by providing one of the below forms of evidence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- English language proficiency confirmation letter from the home university international office (only applicable if the student is enrolled in an English-taught academic program)</li> <li>- TOEFL IBT Score: 100 minimum</li> <li>- IELTS Score: 6.5 minimum</li> <li>- Cambridge English: CAE C or CPE C minimum</li> <li>- International Baccalaureate: English A2 Higher Level of Standard Level (tot 2013), Language and Literature Higher Level of Standard Level (vanaf 2013)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
