

## TUM Nomination and Application Procedure

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### Nomination for Partner Institutions

All relevant information with further instructions for the online nomination will be emailed to our partners in March (for winter semester) and September (for summer semester). The students are free to choose the campus. The home university informs TUM School of Management about the campus choice via the nomination. It is not possible to change the campus during the exchange period.

### Application Process for Prospective Incoming Exchange Students

After an acknowledgment email from TUM, students apply within our application period, as mentioned on the [TUM Global & Alumni website for incoming students](#). Students are free to choose one of our campuses. The home university will inform us about the campus choice. We want to point out that changing the campus during the exchange period is impossible. Only applications submitted before the application deadline will be considered. Detailed application information for incoming exchange students from Erasmus+/SEMP countries OR NON-Erasmus+ countries (school partnerships) can be found on this [website](#) under program overview.

#### The application process is as follows:

1. A complete application must be done via the [online application portal](#).
2. Necessary documents have to be uploaded.

#### Required documents to be uploaded:

1. One-page letter of motivation (either in English or German)
2. Curriculum vitae (either in English or German)
3. (preliminary) Learning Agreement / Study Plan (courses students want to attend at TUM; at least 60% of the courses have to be from TUM School of Management)
4. Transcript of records (all grades attained at home university)
5. Document listing the courses that students attend in their current semester (and therefore are not yet listed in the transcript).
6. An official language certificate for English (B2 CEF) (and German (B2) if the student likes to follow German-taught courses). We also accept an official confirmation about the language level from the home university.

### Language Proficiency

Depending on the courses applicants intend to follow at TUM School of Management, they have to give proof of a B2 level command (or equivalent) in English and/or German. We

## Visa Requirements/ Residence Permit Application

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<b>Entry Regulations</b>	Applicants from EU/EFTA countries and some other nations do not need a visa to study in Germany. Applicants from non-EU nations typically need a visa to study in Germany. To find out if they need a visa and how to apply, they must contact the embassy or consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany in their home country. Application processing times can vary greatly depending on the volume of applications and the applicant's home country. Submitting the complete application at least two months before the student's departure is recommended. <b>Please note:</b> Students cannot travel to Germany on a tourist visa since this cannot be changed into a student visa. Students in Germany on a tourist visa are not entitled to study there.

## Health Insurance

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<b>Are students required to get health insurance?</b>	Health insurance is compulsory in Germany. Students cannot register at TUM without proof of German national insurance. To ensure that coverage is sufficient to meet German national standards, it is recommended that students purchase an in-country medical insurance plan. Travel insurance is not accepted.

## Banking

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<b>Do students have to open a bank account while studying in Germany?</b>	It is highly advisable to open a bank account in Germany. German banks offer accounts free of charge for students. Debit cards from German banks are accepted throughout Europe.
<b>What are acceptable credit cards in Germany?</b>	In Munich, all major credit cards are accepted. However, not all stores accept credit cards; some shops only accept cash payments. Credit cards are usually not accepted in smaller cities and towns outside of Munich.
