Student Exchange

Broaden your education by studying one or more units at VU. If your home university is one of our international exchange partners, you can apply to be nominated to study with us on Student Exchange. No tuition fees are payable to VU; your home institution's fees will apply.

Study Abroad

Alternatively, if you cannot secure an exchange place or if your home university doesn't have an exchange agreement with us, you can come as a Study Abroad student, paying fees direct to VU but still receiving credit for your studies when you return to your home institution.

Study Abroad and Exchange students can choose from a wide range of subjects while completing your semester(s) at VU. Study areas include:

- ◆ Science
- ◆ Health and Biomedicine
- ◆ Information Technology

Undergraduate students focus on one subject at a time, in four-week blocks and small, interactive classes, a method that has significantly improved student engagement and results. Some postgraduates study two subjects at a time over eight-week blocks.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for entry into the Study Abroad or Student Exchange program, you must provide proof of enrolment in a university degree and evidence of a 65% average in your studies or a 2.5 grade point average on a scale of 4 or equivalent.

You will also need to provide evidence that you meet VU's English language requirements:

- ◆ Academic IELTS overall score of 6.0 (with no band less than 6.0), or equivalent, for entry into undergraduate degrees.
- ◆ Academic IELTS overall score of 6.5 (with no band less than 6.0), or equivalent, for entry into postgraduate degrees.

Study and assessment

Units are taught one at a time over four-week blocks for undergraduates and two at a time over eight-week blocks for some postgraduates. Each unit has around three face-to-face teaching sessions per week, in small interactive classes lasting 2-3 hours each.

Assessment can include written work and tests undertaken in class or online; group presentations; fieldwork, practical or laboratory experience; and final examinations.

Study credit

Credit equivalencies for a semester (four units) of full time study at Victoria University are:

- ◆ USA: 12-15 credits
- ◆ Canada: 15 credits
- ◆ Europe: 30 ECTS
- ◆ UK: 60 credits or 30 ECTS
- ◆ Japan: 15 credits.

Flexible intakes and durations

At VU we offer extremely flexible options for Study Abroad and Student Exchange students. We offer four intakes throughout the year, as shown in the diagram below. Choose to study with us for anything from one block* (four weeks) to two semesters (one year) – whatever works for you!

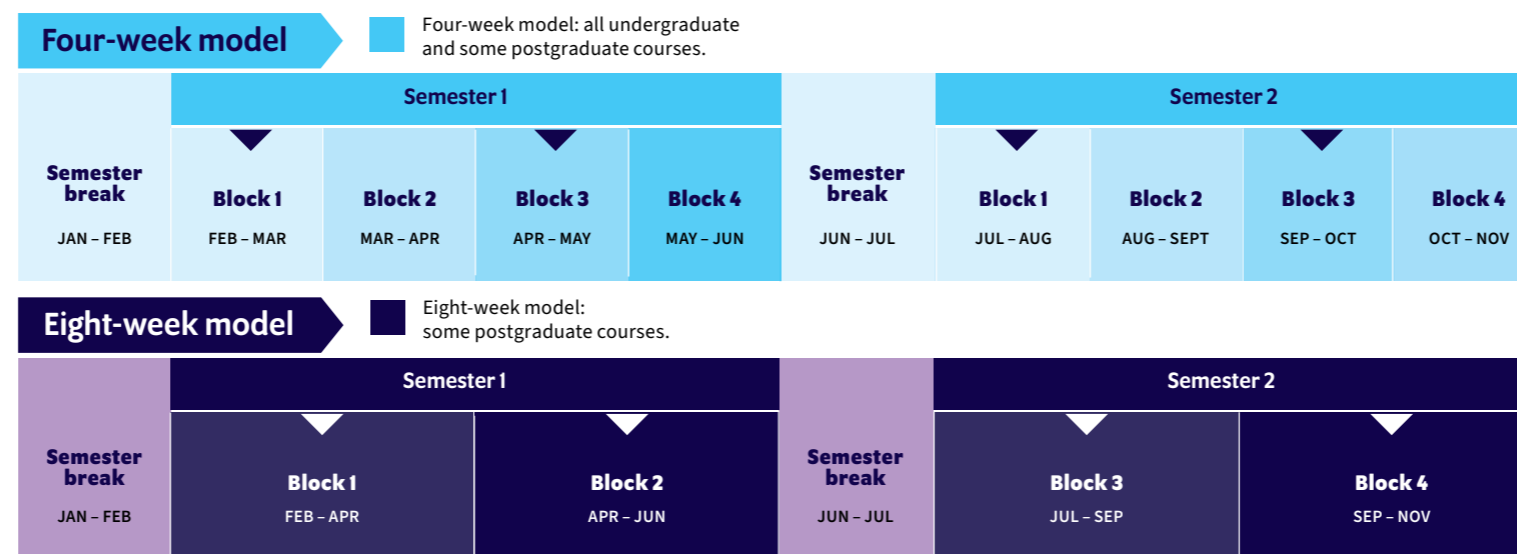

City Campus

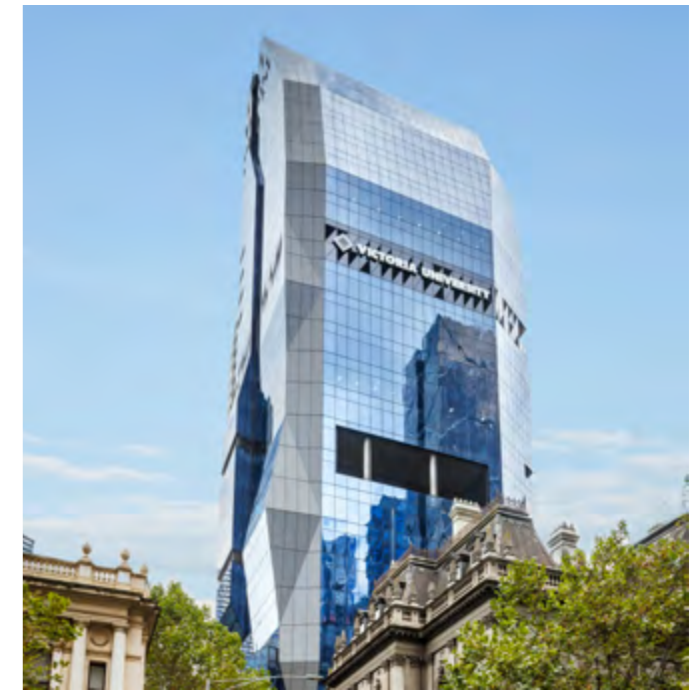
VU City Tower

Student support

At VU, we believe in learning environments where everyone feels welcome and included. Our free support services will set you up to achieve your best and make the most of your time in Melbourne.

Airport pick-up

When you first arrive in Melbourne, we can welcome you at the airport and take you to your accommodation. This free service is available if you register your request at least 5 days before arrival.

Employment support

On a student visa, you're allowed to work part-time in Australia up to 48 hours per fortnight. Our VU Careers Hub service will support you to improve your CV, search for jobs in Melbourne and polish your interview techniques.

VUHQ

Accommodation



UniLodge Victoria University

If you're looking for a great place to live in Melbourne, we offer guaranteed accommodation at UniLodge Victoria University – our safe, welcoming and affordable student accommodation complex that's the perfect place to make new friends.

UniLodge VU offers a range of room options at affordable prices that include unlimited WiFi and all energy bills, so you won't have to worry about additional costs. It's also just a short walk or train ride from our main VU campuses in the west and centre of Melbourne.

As well as fully furnished apartments, the complex features an exciting range of facilities, including:

- ◆ high-tech study rooms and 24/7 security
- ◆ gourmet kitchens, dining rooms, a shop and café
- ◆ TV lounges and a cinema room with streaming services
- ◆ a basketball half-court, BBQ, pool table, table tennis table and rooftop garden.

Other accommodation options

UniLodge also has accommodation options in central Melbourne for anyone who prefers to be right in the heart of the city, or for use in rare cases when our Footscray complex is entirely full. If you prefer to rent privately, options include:

- ◆ homestays: live with a local family in their home for a minimum of four weeks. VU's preferred homestay provider is the Australian Homestay Network
- ◆ share houses: rent a room in a house and share facilities
- ◆ private rentals: houses, flats, units and apartments, usually unfurnished
- ◆ short-stay: hotels, hostels and private rooms give you somewhere to stay while you look for longer-term options.

VU student housing service

Once you arrive in Australia, our student housing service can provide:

- ◆ access to the VU student housing database – a free online guide with a list of property vacancies
- ◆ a student housing guide with tips, checklists and links
- ◆ information about moving in, staying, and moving out of a rental property
- ◆ rental information in multiple languages
- ◆ support with housing issues.

Book in advance

We recommend booking accommodation before you arrive in Australia, at least for the first few weeks. An inspection should be conducted before agreeing to a long-term private rental or share house arrangement.



Fees and living costs

Before you start your studies, it's a great idea to prepare a budget based on your lifestyle and accommodation choices. This page offers an indication of some of the main expenses of studying and living in Melbourne.

Living costs

As a condition of your student visa you must have enough money to pay the costs of your stay, including your travel and living expenses.

Health insurance

You must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) to obtain a student visa. Victoria University can arrange your OSHC for you, which gives you extra benefits over any policy that you can purchase directly.

There are no tuition fees payable to VU for Student Exchange when you are nominated as an exchange student by one of our international exchange partners. Your home institution's fees will apply.

Additional expenses

Coming to a new country, you'll also need to budget for compulsory health insurance, visas, travel and living costs. VU campuses are easily accessible through Melbourne's public transport network and close to some of the city's best markets, where you can save money on fresh food and other essentials. Expect to spend at least AU\$100 per week on food and drink.
