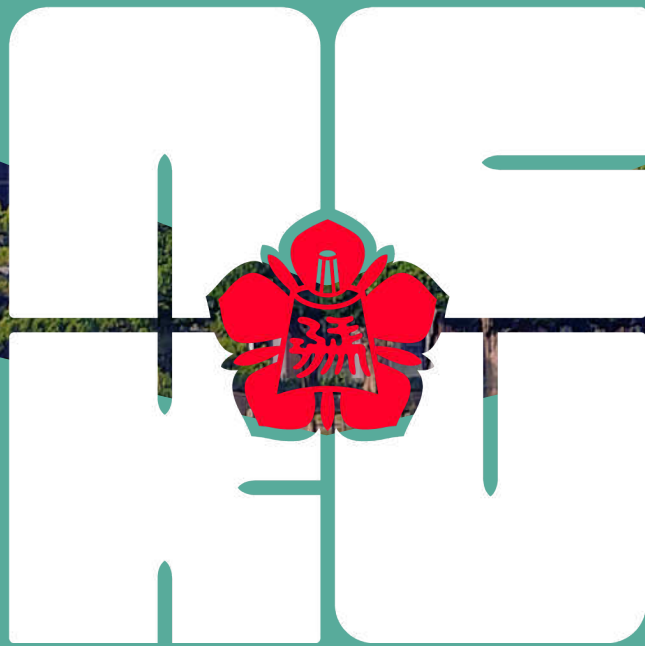

# Student Exchange Program

Students currently enrolled at a partner university of NCKU are eligible for the bilateral Student Exchange Program (SEP) at NCKU. At NCKU, international exchange students could enjoy the advantages of studying abroad and experiencing Asian culture, highlighted with Taiwanese hospitality within an educational environment. Students are advised to seek an internal nomination by their home universities for one semester or two on exchange at NCKU. If you are not a student from a partner school, you can still choose to participate in the exchange program at your own expense.

## Free Chinese Language Courses

NCKU encourages international exchange students to understand Chinese culture and people in their own tongue. To facilitate such in-depth understanding, NCKU has sponsored a 2-credit Chinese language course, free of charge. All proficiency levels are available.

Exchange students may apply to get individual assistance from local students on tasks including dorm check-in, registration, course enrollment, and other essential matters during their exchange periods. 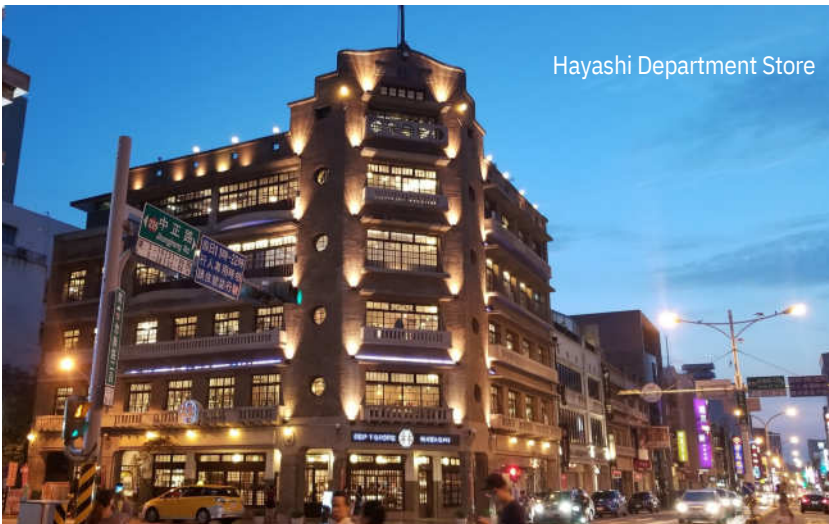

## Must Do in Tainan

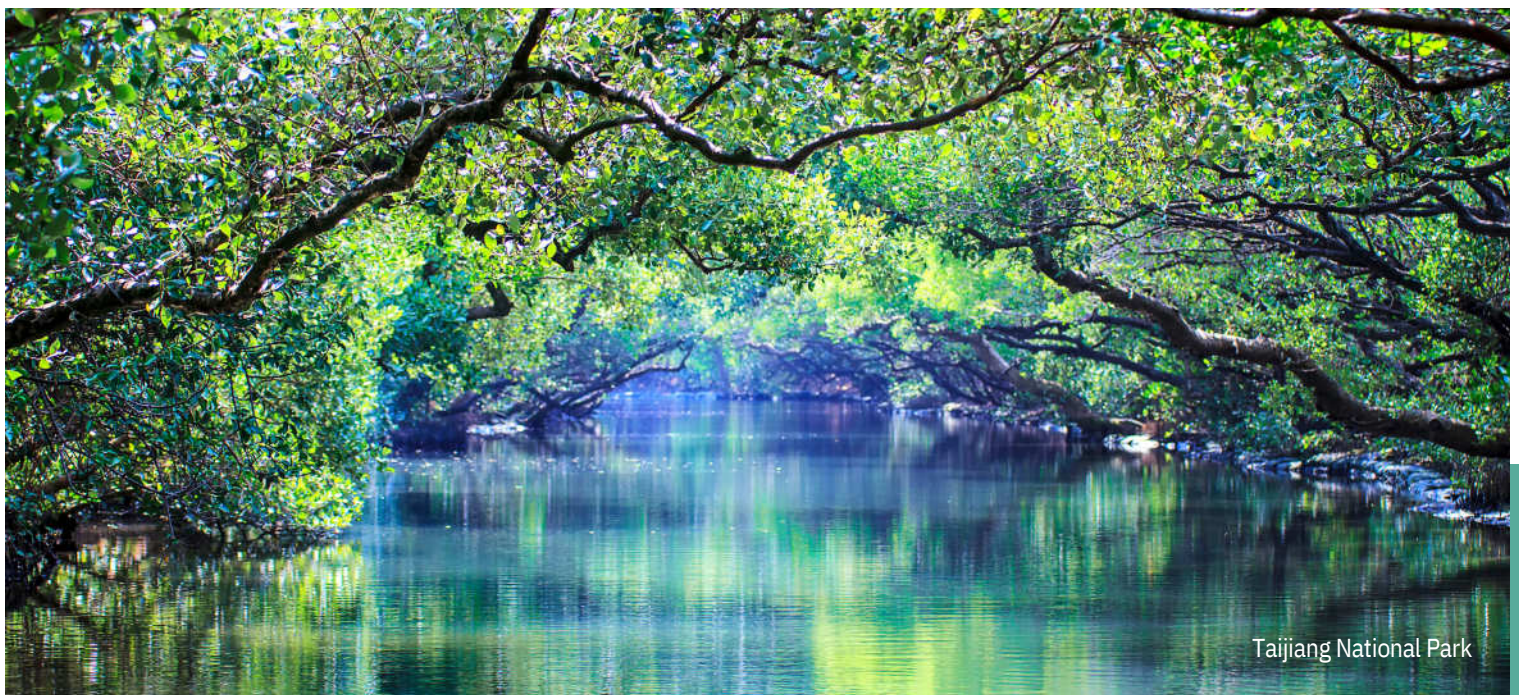
- Savoring a diverse array of local delicacies.

## English-Taught Courses

Courses are primarily taught in Chinese at NCKU. However, a substantial portion of courses taught at the graduate level is in English. A total of 751 English-taught courses have been offered across the 11 colleges and 85 departments.

## Course Enrollment Policy

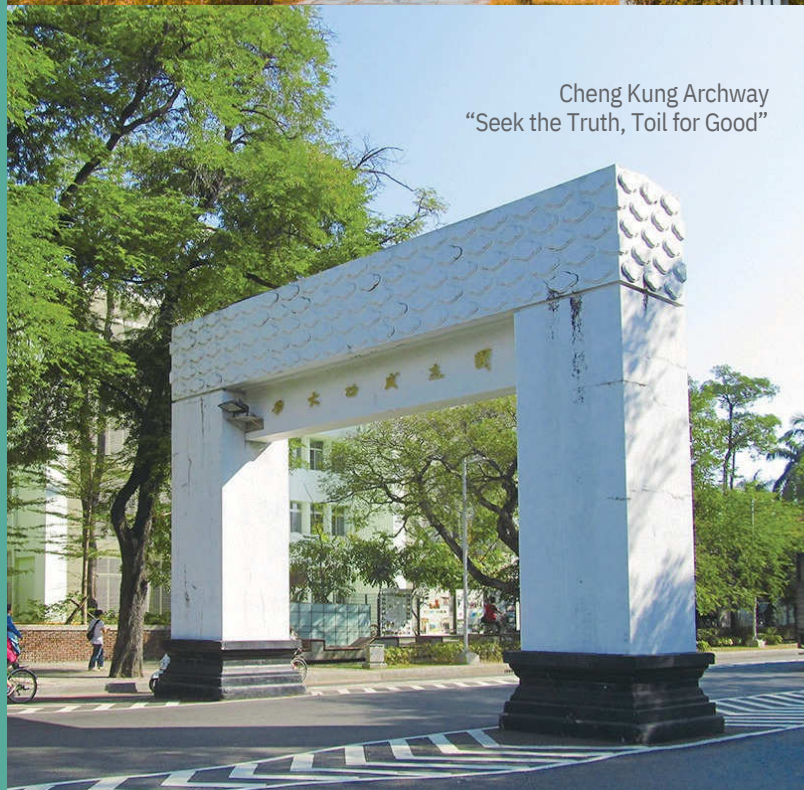

## Accommodation and Living Expenses\*

**On-campus dormitory** | About NTD 15,730 / semester\*\* (≈USD 560/≈EUR 450)

**Off-campus housing** | NTD 5,000-9,000 / month (≈USD 170-300 /≈EUR 150-270)

**Living expenses** | NTD 10,000-15,000 / month (meals, transportation, etc. ≈USD 330 /≈EUR 300)

**Textbooks** | Varies.

**Estimated expenses in total** | **NTD \$50,000-NTD \$60,000 /semester (≈USD 2,000 /≈EUR 1,790)**

\*\* NCKU provides on-campus dormitories for exchange students. Room availability is not guaranteed due to changes in demand each year. NCKU will advise you on off-campus accommodations upon request.
